

f-stop always starts in lower case, even if it's on the beginning of the sentence. Even the brands website is "www.fstopgear.com", the brand itself is called only "f-stop".

Correct example: "f-stop designs and manufactures modular camera packs..."

PACK FEATURES

- The main body material used on both the Mountain and Urban Series is a 440D Rip Stop Nylon - a material that is made using a special reinforcing technique that makes them resistant to tearing and ripping.
- The packs feature a DWR coating. This makes them weatherproof but NOT waterproof. They are made out of waterproof materials, but since they are assembled using a sewing technique, they are not waterproof.
- Key critical points feature weatherproof zippers and/or zipper garages as well as zipper protecting lids
- All Mountain Series and Ultralight Series backpacks feature an internal aluminum frame (removable) for increased stability and comfort
- All packs feature a variety of adjustment points for the carry harness to best possible "custom fit" the pack to the user's anatomy
- Access to the main compartment is possible through the back panel of the pack to provide security in transport and sketchy environments (theft protection as opening is against users back)
- The camera packs are modular, they fit up to a certain size of ICU, depending on the size of the pack
- o ICU = Internal Camera Unit, you can also stack ICU's on top of each other
- o In the pack there are ICU attachment points that are used to optionally secure the ICU inside the pack (two on bottom left/right sides, two on top left/right sides)
- There are 9 ICU's in total providing different depth and heights for any situation and pack combination



FURTHER FEATURES

- The elastic pull cords on the front can be used to strap a small tripod, ice axes or hiking/skiing poles.
- The bottom of the pack is made out of Hypalon material which is famous for high resistance to the extremes an outdoor environment provides
- There are a variety of mounting/attachment points (Gate-Keeper Loops) around the bags for adding additional gear on the outside of the pack & extending the volume of it
- o Gate-Keepers are an accessory available separately

LOADING THE PACK

Step 1

- o Open the ICU and insert your gear inside
 - a. Secure the gear with the elastic bands
 - b. Don't close the ICU
 - c. Take the top lid of the ICU and fold it behind
 - d. Once you have the ICU set up, open the top zipper of the pack and insert the ICU inside the pack

(The opening of the ICU should face the back of the camera pack - towards the back panel)

Step 2

- Secure the ICU with the Velcro straps.
- o Close the camera pack and put down the flaps of the zipper

Step 3

Open the back panel of the pack and the gear should be at your disposal
